Position Description

Metrics for Management is seeking 3 experienced health program evaluation consultants with local health system experience, one in each evaluation country: Indonesia, Kenya, Nigeria. The consultants will support multiple rounds of data collection for a cancer patient support initiative in each country. This opportunity is part of a competitive bidding process and is contingent upon M4M being awarded the contract.

A patient advocate organization has launched an initiative to enhance patient support for chronic disease management in Indonesia, Kenya, and Nigeria, supported by a multi-million dollar, six-year grant. The initiative aims to expand capacity across multiple health facilities and patient organizations at the national and sub-national level.

The program drives changes in patient navigation policy and practice by supporting national leaders in creating an enabling policy environment. It also empowers leaders of national and sub-national health institutions and chronic disease management organizations to design and implement effective, sustainable, and coordinated patient navigation programs tailored to their country's cancer care systems, needs, and available resources.

We anticipate that each consultant will support our team for approximately 20 days in year 1, and 20 days in year 4, with limited need for support in the intervening years.

Key Responsibilities:



- Review and provide feedback on the team’s proposed approach
- Support production of detailed inception reports for evaluation, including context-specific data collection tools
- Prepare and submit Institutional Review Board (IRB) submission packages for all evaluation phases, serving as in-country point of contact
- Coordinate qualitative and quantitative baseline and endline data collection activities
- Conduct in-country qualitative data collection
- Support data analysis, and interpretation.
- Support development and review of user-friendly summaries of key findings for diverse stakeholder audiences
- Collaborate in production of manuscripts for publication evaluation findings
- Collaborate with M4M investigator, program teams and local partners to ensure culturally appropriate and context-relevant evaluation approaches
- Ensure data quality, ethical compliance, and timely delivery of all evaluation deliverables

Qualifications

- Currently living or working in one of the 3 project countries
- Master’s degree in public health, epidemiology, health sciences, social sciences, or a related field
- Demonstrated experience designing and conducting research studies, including data collection, analysis, and reporting
- Proven experience working within hospital or clinical settings in a project country
- Strong written and verbal communication skills in English, and excellent communication skills in language(s) relevant to project country, with the ability to produce high-quality reports and presentations
- Ability to work collaboratively with multidisciplinary teams and engage effectively with local stakeholders and health professionals
- Excellent proficiency in online communications and document collaboration tools, such as Zoom and Google Drive.

The ideal candidates will have:

- Strong understanding of cancer care delivery, particularly in resource-limited contexts
- Expertise in qualitative research methods, including conducting interviews, focus groups, and thematic analysis
- Experience submitting studies for ethical review in a project country
